Kansas Basketball Event

Reasoning for Event:

The Kansas Basketball Event will be hosted to provide small town high school student-athletes of Southwest Kansas, the opportunity to gain exposure from colleges that are not familiar with the area in which the student-athletes compete.

Location/ Dates:

The Kansas Basketball Academy Foundation will rent out Pratt High School Gymnasium for the day(s) of the event at the rate in which the school charges. The events will be held on the day(s) of April 2-3.

How the Student-Athletes Will Be Informed About the Event:

The KBAF staff will send Athletic Directors of Kansas high schools a brochure about KBAF. They will also receive entry forms to pass out to senior student-athletes that are interested in participating in the event. This is **NOT** an invitational event. This is an open event to student-athletes interested in receiving a scholarship to continue their athletic careers and pursue their academic endeavors.

Cost of the Event:

The registration fee will be \$25 per student-athlete. The \$25 will cover registration for the student-athlete, and an event t-shirt.

Colleges Attending:

All colleges attending the Kansas Basketball Event will be in the open recruiting period of their respective divisions.

The Event

Basketball Stationary Drills:

The student-athletes will be broken into groups and put through 4-6 basketball drills. These drills will help the college coaches get a better look at the student-athletes work ethic, individual athleticism, and also their strengths and weaknesses on the basketball court. This will also help the event staff with the construction of the teams so we can make them as balanced as possible.

- **Duration of Drills:** 1 hour
- **Types of drills:** Ball Handling, Defense, Shooting, 1-on-1 competitive drills, etc.
- **Drill Coaches:** Event Staff

Event Games:

- 20 – minute halves (running clock)
- Mandatory Substitutions
- 1-and-1 during the last 2 minutes of each half
- 6 foul limit per player
- EVERY PLAYER MUST PLAY IN EACH HALF!!!!

Event Tournament:

The teams will be put into a single elimination tournament format. The same rules from the event games will apply to the tournament. The team that wins the tournament will receive a Kansas Basketball Event Champion t-shirt.

Kansas Basketball Academy Foundation Scholarship:

The Kansas Basketball Academy Foundation will award a male and female student-athlete both a \$150 scholarship to the institution of their choice. This scholarship will be awarded to the male and female student-athlete with the highest G.P.A. during the time of the event. Transcripts will be viewed, but not kept.
